

## Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch Up Premium: 2016-17

The literacy and numeracy catch-up premium gives schools additional funding to support Year 7 students who did not achieve the expected standard in reading or maths at the end of key stage 2. We have identified students who need extra support from the Year 7 catch-up premium and have decided the best way to use the funding. We have used the funding to pay for an intensive small-group 'Access' pathway to help develop literacy skills which are transferrable across all subjects. The focus of this group is to raise individual literacy and numeracy levels whilst accessing a programme of study that is parallel to the schools English and mathematics curriculum.
