- **Question 5** – Produce a non-fiction piece of writing, based on the given statement (*40 marks: 24 for content, 16 for spelling, punctuation and grammar, 45 mins*).

Please divide your time equally between both questions, about 50 minutes on each.

Literature Paper 2: Modern texts and poetry

Section A: Modern prose or drama

- You will be given an option of **TWO** questions to choose from for your chosen text.
- Please answer one of the **TWO** questions relating to: **An Inspector Calls (50 mins). The question is worth 34 marks, 4 awarded for spelling, punctuation and grammar.**

Section B: AQA Anthology: Power and Conflict Poetry

- You will be given a printed poem and a question, asking you to focus on the given poem and one other poem of your choice.
- Please answer the question on: **Power and conflict poetry (50 mins). The question is worth 30 marks; you are not marked for spelling, punctuation and grammar.**

Section C: Unseen poetry

- You will be given two unseen poems to answer two questions on.
- The first question is worth **24 marks**. You will be asked to focus on one unseen poem, and spend about **25 minutes** on this.
- The second question is worth **8 marks**. You will be asked to focus on a second unseen poem, and write a short comparison with the first unseen poem. You should spend about **10 minutes** on this.

Summary of assessment

Unit 1: The Hospitality and Catering Industry

- 40% (90 marks) are assessed through a written examination. The exam lasts for 1 hour 30 mins and has the option to be completed online.

Unit 2: Hospitality and Catering in Action

- 60% non-examination assessment: internally assessed, externally moderated. This lasts for 9 hours and includes a practical exam.
- The 4 hour practical exam is a two course meal for two people with accompaniments.

- Understand and explore the Hospitality and Catering industry, the job roles and the different types of equipment used to support the industry.
