

Diversity



Tolerance



- Microaggression is a term used for brief and commonplace daily verbal, behavioral or environmental indignities, whether intentional or unintentional, that communicate hostile, derogatory, or negative attitudes toward stigmatized or culturally marginalized groups.

Some examples

- An example of this would be the use of the word gay. We do not use this word in a negative manner and better if we do not use it at all. You may think it is innocently said but this causes offence.
- Drawing attention to difference with the use of offensive language.
- Any word that can be used in a negative way will not be tolerated.
- Misconception around people that share those qualities are able

to use those words. This is also not acceptable.

How to keep yourself Safe

Do not post unkind things or like unkind things on social media, even if you do not know the person.
