- TERM 1 -

The Challenge of Natural Hazards

At the start of this term, you will complete your studying of river landscapes in the UK. You will then move onto studying the tectonic and climatic hazards around the world and how we as people cope with the ever-changing dynamics of the natural world including the causes, impacts and solutions to climate change.



LINKS TO PRIOR LEARNING



- TERM 2 -

Urban Issues and Challenges

In this term, you will begin to understand the human geography of the world. In particular, you will see how the world's urban areas are developing, as well as looking at some of the opportunities and challenges that occur within these environments. You will study an example of urban change in a HIC and a LIC/NEE.



LINKS TO PRIOR LEARNING

There are numerous links with these topics that can be made from KS3 from the study of Uganda in Year 9 to the connected world in Year 8 and challenging cities in Year 7.



- TERM 3 -

The Living Word (Rainforests and Hot Deserts) and a Fieldwork Opportunity

In the final term, you will be studying global biomes across the world, with a particular focus on tropical rainforests and hot deserts. We will look at plant and animal adaptations and human interactions. In the final weeks of the term, we will then be completing a piece of

fieldwork that will be assessed in your Paper 3 exam.
