Coronavirus Update

We have been checking and following the advice of the DFE and Public Health England on a daily basis. I have been really pleased with the way that our students have listened and engaged with the advice given regarding handwashing and helping to prevent the spread of germs and viruses.

As you are aware, in some other countries they have made the decision to close schools. The Prime Minister has been very clear (at the time of writing) that there is no need to close schools in the UK at the moment. We are however prepared for this situation if the government decide to change their policy. If this did happen, we know that students all over the country would move to online learning. We do not want our children to fall behind their competitors across the country and have a comprehensive online learning package ready. We have shown all students how to access this via their Show My Homework accounts. Parents can download the app to see what work is set and monitor their children's work. If you would like any support with Show My Homework, please contact students services.

The school will remain open as normal unless we are instructed by the government to do otherwise. 




Year 8 Options Evening
