What have we been learning?

Years 3 and 4 have settled back into school really well. All children have been working on the topic of 'Who Am I?' and 'Where Do I Fit In?'. We have learnt about ourselves, our feelings and where we come from as well as using R.E. to talk about our choices.

What will we be learning next term?

Our topic continues next half term as we look closely at the geography of our own country and of that in Europe. We will also be investigating where we come from in the past by looking at the Stone Age through to the Roman Age. In year 4, we will be continuing our studies by focussing on Greece and the ancient Greeks.

Reading

All children have been given their new Accelerated Reader levels this half term and we are completing quizzes daily. Please continue to read with your child every night for 10 minutes.



Homework

Homework is set every Friday and is due in the following Wednesday. Please spend time with your child completing the set tasks and ask your child's teacher if any support is required. Children all have access to Times Table Rockstars and Numbots. These apps will help your child develop fluency in times table and number facts which are vital. Please encourage your child to access these excellent resources regularly at home.

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Food & Drink

Please note that pupils are allowed to bring in a healthy snack of fruit or vegetables to eat at break time. Here are some ideas of foods that can be brought in: apples, pears, bananas, grapes, carrot sticks, cherry tomatoes, raisins and dried apricots. Could we request that only water is brought into the classroom and no flavoured water or juice. These tend to be full of sugars, and if spilt in the classroom stain work and leave a sticky residue.



Reading

Reading remains at the heart of our curriculum and is the golden thread which links together everything that we do. We value your support in encouraging your child to read at home as often as possible. It really does make such a difference to their learning!

To this end, the Reading Challenge is now live! Pupils have been given the opportunity to read 5 books within their reading level across the year to earn a certificate and prizes. Take a look at ClassDojo for more information or contact your child's class teacher.

ClassDojo

With these continuing uncertain times, it is really important that you are signed up to ClassDojo so we have a way to contact and support your child should we be forced to go into another lock down. If you have not signed up yet,



please contact the school to ask for your child's unique code. ClassDojo is a completely free service. They do have premium options but we do not use these within school and you will not be expected to sign up for them.

With this in mind, have you registered for virtual learning through parent pay? If not, please take a moment to do so. This is also free and will allow us to deliver live lessons should the school be closed. Parents evening this term will also be delivered via a virtual platform so unless you have consented you will not be able to receive an appointment to discuss your child's progress with their teacher.

Have you checked out how many Dojo points your child has? These are the top scorers this half term in Years 5 and 6!



Homework

Pupils are given a piece of maths, English and spelling homework every week to consolidate the work that they have been doing in class. The red homework books are handed out on a Friday and are due back in school on Wednesday. This is so that we have time to mark and prepare next week's work. Thank you for your continuing support in ensuring that your child's homework is completed every week.




Next Half Term's Learning Activities

In Year 5 this term we have been enjoying reading The Explorer by Katherine Rundell and we will continue with this next term looking at creating an Amazon rainforest survival guide.

In maths, next half term, we will be studying statistics, multiplication, division and the perimeter and area of shapes.

In our topic lessons, we will be learning about South America. This will include map skills, art and D&T skills. In our weekly music lessons we will be learning about Classroom Jazz music. All this as well as ICT, Spanish, PSHE and PE every Wednesday afternoon.





In Year 6 this term we have been reading and enjoying Wonder by R J Palicio and we will continue with this next term finishing in time to study the Night Before Christmas Poem to get us in the mood for the holidays through some performance poetry!

In maths next half term, we will be learning how to use the four number operations with fractions before moving onto position and direction work just before Christmas.

In our topic lessons, we will be learning all about North America. This work will include map skills, art-work and considering the history of this part of the world. The pupils will also be enjoying weekly music and ICT lessons, PSHE sessions and a Spanish lesson fortnightly as well as their weekly Tuesday PE lesson.
