





How was the competition? "It was good."

Safeguarding News



If you have any issues with getting on to SMH, please don't hesitate to come and see Mr Morton.




Well-being News in STEPS (Sociology, Theology, Ethics, Politics & Social Studies)

Year 7 have been covering well-being related content in their STEPS lessons this term. 




Tutors will be monitoring attendance daily over the next few weeks to ensure students are meeting the academy targets. Thank you for your continued support with attendance.


