Muslim Beliefs and Christian Beliefs

From a dozen people in Jerusalem in the first century, Christianity now has more than 24 million believers all over the world. In Great Britain, Christianity is still the main religious tradition, despite a growing number of people who do not identify with any religion.

Muslims believe that when Allah created the world he did so in an orderly manner, giving each form of life a good purpose. However, humans have a choice over whether they wish to submit to the will of Allah and follow their natural good purpose.

Peace and Conflict/ Marriage and the Family
