### HALF TERM 1: An Inspector Calls & Language Paper 2 Reading

In Year 11, we continue our chronological journey through English Literature. We will build on our existing knowledge of modernism and the social changes of the 20<sup>th</sup> century, which is the setting of modern play, *An Inspector Calls*, set in Edwardian Britain, but written in post-WWII society. J.B. Priestley's commentary exposes us to the class system in Britain and the conflict between capitalism and socialism, allowing us once again to see literature through a social lens.

### HALF TERM 2:

Power & Conflict Poetry, Language Paper 2 Writing, Speaking & Listening

We will consolidate our study of modernism by revising the poetry that we studied in Year 10 and exploring contemporary poems that explore ideas of identity. We will continue to develop our opinion writing across a range of non-fiction genres, presenting our perspectives on a range of social issues. This will build towards our Speaking & Listening qualifications, for which we will write and present a short speech engaging with an interesting, socially relevant topic.
